### **Vanished – Allison Jackson Foy Join's Other Cases**

*Families Left with Unanswered Cases of Missing People*

Wilmington, NC – The CUE Center for Missing Persons is looking back on cases stacking up that are cold and currently not solved. Some cases reach as far back as 1995 extending to July of 2006. Cases go cold for many reasons, said CUE's Founder, 'Monica Caison'. The largest reason would be the activity or lack of leads, "she added". But one thing is agreed on by families across the nation, you must look for a missing person to locate one.

Resource available today and technology are more advanced to better serve the missing; so why is it not used in protocol for missing adults? It is well known adults have a right to privacy and can walk away from their lives if they choose. Advocates all over are saying the scenario is not always common. It is the forgotten and untold stories of hundreds who never grabbed the headlines, assumed the person walk out on life, or the case simply was not intriguing enough.

On the heels of the missing man - Jeff Keller being found alive proves not all adults walk away and deserve the right to be searched for and brought home. Hope still remains in several area families that their loved one will be found, not matter the end result.

#### **Below is just a handful of North Carolina endangered - missing adults**

January 2, 2006, Julie Michelle Bullard was reported missing from Broadway, NC, after a masked gun man enter a residence and abducted her at gun point.

February 17, 2006 Scott Rabun was reported missing from Chapel Hill, NC after mysteriously disappearing from his studio apartment and not heard from by family and friends.

April 4, 2006 Barry Goins was reported missing from Raleigh, NC after he wandered from his family home. Barry is in need of medical attention.

July 30, 2006, Allison Jackson Foy left her employment at the Holiday Inn Hotel in Wilmington and stopped in at the Junction Billiard's to see friends, she vanished.

September 5, 2005, Carol Dowless was reported missing from Whiteville, NC after a night out with a friend and returning to her Whiteville home.

July 7, 2004 Delwin Locklear was reported missing from Maxton, NC after family saw he had not been home and his truck parked at his home.

July 24, 2003 Robert Connor was reported missing from Claremont, NC after several days of not being heard from and no sign of anyone being at his home.

January 25, 2001, Michelle Haggadon, a Wilmington resident was reported missing from Leland, NC after an outing, she did not return to her boyfriend's home.

September 12, 2001 Pamela Bradshaw was reported missing from Wilmington, NC after being seen getting into a vehicle in front of her home.

September 12, 1998, Vyacheslav Akopov was reported missing from Bladenboro, NC, by his landlord after not arriving at work and returning home for some time.

February 27, 1998 Troy Lee Jacobs was reported missing from Raeford, NC after not returning from walking to a nearby friend's home.

February 12, 1995, Rosalind Wall was reported missing from Southport, NC, after leaving Skippers Lounge where she had been employed as a bartender.

July 6, 1995, Tammy Ferguson was reported missing from Leland, NC after walking to use a nearby pay phone to call her mother.

July 14, 1995, Timothy Smart was reported missing from Boling Springs Lake, NC, after not showing up for a job scheduled in South Carolina.

April 15, 1994, Deloris Melton was reported missing from Ocean Isle Beach., NC after leaving Hides Tides Bar and not returning to her work place or home.

Most of the cases came to the CUE Center 'cold', but the center has provided continually support for the left behind families, conducted search efforts, and will continue to follow up on any information that develops. We are here for these families who suffer a missing loved one for the long hall, always reminding the public they remain missing, said, CUE's Founder, 'Monica Caison'.
